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
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5. WHAT TO KNOW ABOUT TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO

Trinidad and Tobago is located in the southern Caribbean, just off the coast of Venezuela.The climate is tropical with average temperatures ranging from 75 degrees F to 85 degrees F (24 degrees C to 30 degrees C). The dry season is from January to May and the rainy season is from June to December.

Trinidad and Tobago gained its independence from the British on 31 August 1962.

You can get to Trinidad and Tobago by air and sea. Many cruise lines dock in Port of Spain, the capital city. The Piarco International Airport is the main airport serving the islands.



LOCATION OF TRINDAD & TOBAGO

Banks are open from 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. from Mondays through Thursdays and 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on Fridays. Supermarkets and shopping malls are usually open from 9:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. daily. Shops are generally open from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on Mondays through Fridays and 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. on Saturdays. Craft and souvenir shops open on Sundays and Public Holidays when cruise ships are docked. Government offices are generally open from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on Mondays through Fridays. Tobago is the smaller of the two islands and is a popular tourist destination. It is known for its beautiful beaches, lush rainforests, and laid-back atmosphere. Tobago is a 20-minute flight or a 2 1/2 hour ferry ride from Trinidad.

If you would like to continue on to Tobago, you can take a short inter-island flight to the A.N.R. Robinson International Airport or travel there by ferry aboard the T&T Spirit or the Galleons Passage which departs from the Port of Spain Ferry Terminal.


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

The official period is April 17 to April 21, 5 nights .Teams arriving and departing outside the official period will have to make their arrangements.

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7. ACCOMMODATION & REGISTRATION

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7.1 ACCOMMODATION ATHLETES AND OFFICIALS

Athletes and Team Officials will be accommodated at the Radisson and Hyatt Hotels during the period April 17 - April 21. Meals will be provided from dinner on 17th April to breakfast on 22nd April.

7.2 ACCOMMODATION LEVY

The accommodation Levy is USD \$250.00 per team member.

7.3 ADDITIONAL CHARGES

Teams will be responsible for payment for: Any damages sustained to hotel property by members of the delegation, any additional services outside the scope of services

7.4 ACCREDITATION REGISTRATION

The accreditationcentre will be located at the Hyatt Regency Hotel. To be accredited, each athletes must present a valid passport, or certified copy of their birth

7.5 AGE VERIFICATION

BOYS | GIRLS UNDER 20 BORN IN 2006, 2007, OR 2008

BOYS|GIRLS UNDER 17 BORN IN 2009, 2010, OR 2011

AGES ARE AS OF MIDNIGHT ON 31ST DECEMBER 2025.

The ages of all competitors will be verified at the Accreditation Centre. Passports or travel documents of all competitors must be presented on arrival before the accreditation process can be completed.

Heads of delegations must finalize payment of the levy in TT dollars or US currency in order to complete the accreditation process and receive their room keys. Delegations will receive individual identification cards which must be worn for the duration of the Games. These cards will act as access passes to Games hotels, meals, transport, warmup area, competition arena and other facilities as indicated.

Please note that charges for accommodation and meals of additional personnel must be paid at this time as well. The loss or theft of an accreditation card must be reported immediately to the Accreditation Centre. A replacement card will only be provided at a cost of TT\$50.00 after the LOC is satisfied with the explanation offered by the Head of Delegation of the particular team involved. It is important that teams send the required information by the deadline dates to minimise the wait at the Accreditation Center.

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8.1 OPENING CEREMONY

The opening ceremony for the 52 nd CARIFTA Games is planned for Friday 18th April 2025 from 14:30 - 15:30.

Delegations will be transported from Games hotels beginning at 13:30 The LOC requests that all delegations participate in the Opening Ceremony.

8.2 RULES OF COMPETITION

The 52nd CARIFTA Games will be held in accordance with the rules and regulations of World Athletics (WA). All technical matters will be resolved according to the WA rules.

General matters not covered by these rules will be resolved by the Implementation Committee.

8.3 COMPETITION VENUE AND DATES

The Competition Venue will be the Hasely Crawford Stadium in Port of Spain, Trinidad. This facility has a seating capacity of 35,000; Main stand (5000), Bleachers (30,000).

The Athletes would be located in the Northern section of the Bleachers. The competition arena accommodates an eight (8) lane Track, four (4) Long and Triple Jump areas, Two (2) High Jump mats, One (1) Shot Put area, Two (2) Javelin areas, Two (2) Pole Vault areas, and One (1) Discus area. Spike length must not exceed 9mm except for the High Jump and javelin throw where spike length must not exceed 12mm (WA Athletics Shoes Regulations)

Competition dates are Saturday 19 th April 2025 to Monday 21 st April, 2025. Note that a tentative schedule appears in this Manual.

8.4 WARM-UP AND TRAINING FACILITIES

The warm up track is adjacent to the competition arena. It is an eight lane 150m track and has the same surface as the competition track.



8.5 MEDICAL INFORMATION

Off-site medical services will be available at the Port of Spain General Hospital, located approximately 20 minutes from the Stadium, and 20 minutes from the Games Village Hotels. On-site medical and physiotherapy services will be available at the stadium and on call medical service at the Games Village. Ambulances will be on call at the competition arena to deal with any emergency that may arise.

It is expected that major medical treatment, if found necessary, will be borne by the individual and/or by the Association he/she represents. The LOC is negotiating for a waiver of the Registration with the Health Practitioners Board for medical personnel accompanying teams. However, these personnel will only be able provide care to their team members or assist other teams as requested and may accompany their charges to the hospital. They will not be allowed to practice in the hospital in the event that the situation requires such medical attention. Space will be available for physiotherapists of participating teams to care for their charges at the Warmup facility. Teams are asked to bring along their own massage tables. A medical booklet would be made available to teams on arrival.

8.6 TEAM SIZE

NUMBER OF ATHLETES PER TEAM

Each country is allowed a total of eighty (80) athletes. No more than two (2) athletes per country may be entered in any individual or combined event, and only one (1) team per country may be entered in any relay event.

In relay events, each country may declare a pool of six (6) athletes from their total of eighty (80) athletes and may utilize this pool of athletes as they deem appropriate in any round of competition.

If an event cannot be conducted due to insufficient participants, defined as having "not less than five (5) competitors of three (3) different countries" the Implementation Committee shall notify immediately through fax or e-mail, those countries that had entered athletes for such an event or may consider the event an Exhibition.

8.7 TEAM OFFICIALS QUOTA

A MAXIMUM NUMBER OF 12 OFFICIALS WILL BE ALLOWED AS FOLLOWS:

01 - 06 COMPETITORS - One (1) official except for teams with male and female athletes; then two officials will be accepted, one must be female.

07 - 12 COMPETITORS - Two (2) Officials

13 - 18 COMPETITORS - Three (3) Officials

19 - 24 COMPETITORS - Four (4) Officials

25 - 30 COMPETITORS - Five (5) Officials

31 - 36 COMPETITORS - Six (6) Officials

37 - 42 COMPETITORS - Seven (7) Officials

43 - 48 COMPETITORS - Eight (8) Officials

49 - 54 COMPETITORS - Nine (9) Officials

55 - 61 COMPETITORS - Ten (10) Officials

62 - 68 COMPETITORS - Eleven (11) Officials

69 - 80 COMPETITORS - Twelve (12) Officials



8.8 DOPING CONTROL

Tests for doping will be conducted throughout the Competition in accordance with the WA Guidelines for Doping Control. The Doping Control area will be located on the Ground floor in the East of the Stadium.

8.9 TEAM SAFEGUARDING OFFICER

Each delegation participating in the 52nd Carifta Games scheduled for Port of Spain, Trinidad, 19-22 April 2025, must include in its team, a designated Team Safeguarding Officer.

The Team Safeguarding Officers appointed by teams should be individuals who will play an on-going role in their MF on Safeguarding matters, including leading the work within their MF on the development of a safeguarding policy and procedures for dealing with safeguarding issues in their federation.

8.10 WORLD ATHLETIC COURSE REQUIREMENT

That the designated Team Safeguarding Officer must have successfully completed the World Athletic Online Safeguarding Essential Course before travelling with their member federation's delegation to the Games..

8.11 TEAM SAFEGUARDING OFFICERS' TRAINING

NACAC Athletics, in tandem with World Athletics, will conduct a Safeguarding Training Session, conducted for the designated Team Safeguarding Officers in attendance at the Carifta 2025 in Trinidad, on Friday 18 April 2025.

8.14 TECHNICAL MEETING AND INFORMATION CENTRE

This will be held on Friday 19th April 2025 at 10:00AM at the Hasely Crawford Stadium.

Countries shall be represented by only two delegates.

The Technical Information Centre will belocated at the Ground Floor of the West Stand. TIC shall serve as the link between the Implementation Committee and the various delegations.

8.15 CONFIRMATION ENTRY SHEET

Upon arrival each team will be provided with a set of Confirmation of Entry sheets, which must be confirmed and submitted to the TIC.

Confirmation of entries for the first day of competition shall be submitted during the Technical Meeting. For the following days, ONLY the confirmation of omissions shall be submitted to the TIC by 18:00 on the day before the competition.

8.16 START LISTS AND OFFICIAL RESULT

Start Lists will be posted daily at the TIC and warm up area. A copy will be given to the Team Leader upon identification. Results will be posted once the events have been concluded.

Information would be sent digitally also to managers and head coaches of teams.

8.17 NATIONAL FLAG

Each delegation is required to provide two (2) National Flags at accreditation. One will be used during the Opening Ceremony while the other will be flown at the Stadium for the duration of the competition. The flags must be 1.20m x 1.80m (4' 0" x 6' 0").

8.18 COMPETITION NUMBERS

Numbers will be checked in the Call Room to ensure that they correspond with the athletes names. They shall be worn visibly on the breast and back, (except for those competing in the jumping events. Competitors in running events will be issued additional adhesive numbers, which shall be worn on the sides of their shorts or their thighs.

8.19 STARTING HEIGHTS-VERTICAL

Starting and successive heights for High Jump and Pole Vault:

High Jump – Under 17 Girls:

Starting at 1.45m, with increments of 5cm to 1.65m, then up by 3cm to 1.74m, and up by 2cm thereafter

High Jump – Under 17 Boys:

Starting at 1.60m, with increments of 5cm to 2.00m, then up by 3cm to 2.09m, and up by 2cm thereafter..

High Jump – Under 20 Girls:

Starting at 1.55m, with increments of 5cm to 1.70m, then up by 3cm to 1.76m, and up by 2cm thereafter.

High Jump – Under 20 Boys:

Under 20 Boys: Starting at 1.80m, with increments of 5cm to 2.05m, then up by 3cm to 2.14m, and up by 2cm thereafter

Pole Vault – Open Boys:

Starting at 2.85m, with increments of 15cm to 3.90m, then up by 10cm to 4.40m, and up by 5cm thereafter

Pole Vault – Open Girls: Starting at 2.00m, with increments of 15cm to 2.30m, then up

by 10cm to 2.90m and up by 5cm thereafter.

Starting heights for the Combined Events shall be decided at the Technical meeting after submission by countries with athletes in these events. Increments shall be 3cm in the High Jumps and 10cm in the Pole Vault.

There will be two calls for the athletes to report before Call Room 1 is closed and the athletes are escorted to Call Room 2. Under no circumstance will athletes be allowed to enter the competition arena if they fail to comply with these rules

8.21 CALL ROOM INFORMATION

There would be two Call rooms, Call Room One (1) and Call Room Two (2). Call Room One(1) will be located in the vicinity of the warm-up area and would be clearly indicated by signage.

Call Room Two (2) will be located in the North Eastern end of the Stadium Information about these locations in or a The following items are not allowed in the call room:

Personal implements and electronic devices such as iPods, iPads, mp3/4 players, CD Players, Walkmans, Cameras, Mobile Phones, Head-Sets. All items retained in the call room will be returned to the athletes after their event.

MEDIA REGISTRATION

Media accreditation forms can be found in the Appendices. Completed forms must be received by on or before Midnight, Monday 17th March 2025. Please ensure that applications from media houses in your country are stamped by your Federation.

VVIP'S

You are all VIPs; however, delegations with accompanying Government Ministers and other Officials or other VVIPs are required to notify the Local Implementation Committee with full details by on or before Midnight, Monday 17th March 2025. This is to facilitate the necessary protocols.



8.23 PROTESTS

Protests concerning the result or conduct of an event must be made within 30 minutes of the official announcement of the results of that event (WA Technical Rule TR 8.2). Per WA Technical Rule TR8.3, protests shall be made orally to the Referee by an athlete, by someone acting on their behalf, or by an official representative of a team.

Where the Referee is not accessible or available, the protest should be made to them through the Technical Information Centre. The Referee may decide on the protest or may refer the matter to the Jury of Appeal. If the Referee makes a decision, there shall be a right of appeal to the Jury.

Any protest presented before the Jury of Appeal shall be in writing on the official forms provided by the Implementation Committee, signed by a responsible official on behalf of the athlete and accompanied by a deposit of US \$100.00, which shall be forfeited if the appeal is not allowed. (WA Technical Rule TR 8.7) A photocopy of the protest shall be given to the official presenting the protest. The copy will detail the time and date of the protest and the payment of the above-mentioned fee. The Jury of Appeal will give a written resolution to the protest as soon as possible. This resolution will be published in the TIC.
