PASSPORT PRESENTATION / ACCREDITATION

Upon arrival, all delegations will be transported to the Hilton **Princess Hotel Accreditation Center** where athletes will be asked to show their travel documents.

LOC officers at the Accreditation Center will verify the passport and travel documents of all competitors. These will be returned as soon as possible, after verification of age, by the LOC and the Technical Delegate.

ACCOMMODATION RATE AND TEAM SIZE

There will be a lodging tax of *US\$150.00* per team member. This must be paid at the accreditation center before accreditation of the equipment is allowed. The levy will cover the period from 12:00 noon on Friday, July 4 to 12:00 noon on Monday, July 7 (3 nights). Accommodation outside the official period will be at the expense of each delegation.

The number of team officials accompanying each delegation will be limited as follows:

If a team wishes to accommodate additional officials in the accommodation provided by the Organizing Committee, the fee for these additional officials will be US\$150.00 per person per day.

Delegations must inform the local organizing committee of travel plans so that the reception committee can be present at the airport.

PAYMENT METHOD: It will be paid in US dollars at the time of accreditation, no delegation will be able to use lodging, food and internal transportation, as long as the registration is not canceled.

MEDICAL AND LIFE INSURANCE

Each country, according to WA rules, is responsible for the insurance of the participants in its delegation. Member associations are responsible for taking out insurance that covers the illness or injury/life of members of their delegation and/or team when they travel internationally.

Team leaders will be asked to confirm that all athletes are medically fit to participate and must have a list of any recent medications/allergies/illnesses/injuries from all team members. Medical forms, including blood type, must be available to the event doctor in case they are needed in the event of injury or illness during the event.

VISAS

All countries should check with the nearest Nicaraguan Embassy or Consulate to confirm if a VISA, other documentation, or fees are required to enter.

The Organising Committee will make every effort to assist the Federations in obtaining their visas, but must follow the procedures and allow sufficient processing to take place. A letter of invitation will be provided if required. Please inform the LOC in advance.

★ Citizens with passports:

Antigua and Barbados, Bahamas, Barbados, Belize, Canada, Dominican Republic, Panama, Puerto Rico, Mexico, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, Saint Lucia, Saint Kitts and Nevis, Trinidad and Tobago, United States.

Anguilla, Bermuda, Cayman Islands, Monserrat (with UK passport) Martinique, Saint Barthélemy, Saint Martin (with French passport), Virgin Islands (with a United States passport),

Note: Categories "A" are exempt from visas, with a right to stay of 90 days extendable until completing 180 days.

ritizens with passports: Dominica, Grenada, and Jamaica.

Note: Category "B", require consular visa without consultation or border visa, with the right to stay for 30 days, extendable until 90 days are completed.

★ Citizens with passports: Cuba and Haiti,

Note: Category "C" requires a consular visa consulted, with the right to stay for 30 days, extendable until 90 days are completed.

★ In all cases, to enter the national territory they must comply with immigration and health requirements.

NATIONAL FLAGS

Each delegation is requested to provide two national flags for the competition and decoration of the award ceremony. Flags must measure $1.20m \times 0.80m$ and $3m \times 2m$ respectively. They will be flown in the stadium during competitions.

COMPETITION STADIUM

The Athletics Stadium is located in the Nicaraguan Institute of Sports, Plaza España, it has a Level 2 (WA) certified synthetic track Conica brand with 8 lanes, two pits for Long Jump, 2 Shot Put Circles, lane for Ball Throw and areas for High Jump. The warm-up zone is located in the west area of the stadium.









COMPETITION BIBS (NUMBERS)

Each athlete will be assigned three (3) competition bibs that must be visibly worn on the chest and back during the competition (except for Jumps). Athletes without bibs will not be able to enter the competition area. The numbers should not be bent or cut. The third number will be used in the athlete's bag.

TECHNICAL MEETING

The technical meeting will take place on Friday, July 4 at 7:00 p.m. at the Hilton Princess Hotel. Questions of a technical nature must be submitted to the Technical Delegate by teams on the prescribed form, no later than 2:00 p.m. on July 4. Absolutely no questions will be accepted in the room during the technical meeting.

The Technical Delegate will chair the meeting, which will be held in Spanish and translated into English. No more than two (2) delegates from each participating team may attend the meeting.

NACAC AGE GROUP TECHNICAL RULES 2025

TICKETS

- Each team may register two competitors in each combined event per category.
- A maximum of eight (8) athletes will be accepted in the 4 categories per country.
- A country can enter a team in one of the categories and be eligible to win the championship in that category.
- Countries that are unable or unwilling to register full teams in the various categories may register an individual athlete in any category. No country may register more than two athletes in any category.

EVENTS AND CATEGORIES

U13 CATEGORY - PENTATHLON

11 - 12 years old, born between January 1, 2013 and December 31, 2014.

Events: 60-meter dash, 800/1000-meter, long jump, high jump, baseball throw.

Note: Athletes 10 years of age or younger (born in 2015 or later) and athletes 13 years of age or older (born in 2010 or earlier) will not be eligible to participate in this category.

U15 CATEGORY - HEPTATHLON

13 - 14 years old, born between January 1, 2011 and December 31, 2012.

Events: 80-meter dash, 1000/1200-meter dash, 60/80-meter hurdles, long jump, high jump, baseball throw, and shot put.

Note: Athletes 12 years of age or younger (born in 2013 or later) and athletes 15 years of age or older (born in 2010 or earlier) will not be eligible to participate in this category.

1. RULES AND SCORING

Except where otherwise specified, NACAC Age Group Combined Event Scoreboards will be used. Photofinish equipment will be used for track testing.

2. SPEED EVENTS:

- 60-meter run
- 80-meter run
- 60 meters hurdles (girls)
- 80m hurdles (men)

Girls' hurdles measurements: (6 hurdles) height: 0.76mts - 30"

- ✓ Exit at the 1st ditch 12.00 meters
- ✓ Between fences 8.00 meters
- ✓ Last obstacle to the finish line 8.00 meters

Men's hurdle measurements: (8 hurdles) height: 0.84mts - 33"

- ✓ Exit to 1st hurdle 13.00 meters
- ✓ Between fences 8.50 meters
- Last obstacle to reach the finish line 7.50 meters
- Starting blocks are optional, but all athletes must start sprint events in a crouch position. Athletes will receive 2 commands in English: "on your marks" and "set" before shooting.
- Each competitor will be entitled to two (2) false starts; If the athlete has a third false start, the athlete will be disqualified.
- In track testing, competitors will have to stay within their assigned lane and could be disqualified for running outside their lanes.

3. HIGH JUMP

Each competitor is entitled to complete three (3) attempts at each height, starting the jump on two consecutive occasions without completing the jump will constitute an attempt and will be taken as a foul.

to. The starting heights for each category will be:

• Children 11-12 1.10 mts

• Children 13-14 1.25 mts

• Girls 11-12 1.00 mts

• Girls 13-14 1.15 mts

- b. The bar will be raised as follows:
- 5 cm until there are three (3) competitors left.
- 3 cm until the event is completed.

4. LONG JUMP

- to. The take-off board will be white and must be 1.22 m long and 30 cm wide.
- b. The take-off board must be positioned at least 2.00 m away from the landing pit.
- c. Each competitor will have the right to make three (3) attempts.

5. BASEBALL TOSS

- to. An official baseball (5 oz or 150 g) will be used.
- b. The throw must be executed over the shoulder.
- c. Each competitor will have the right to make three (3) attempts.

6. BULLET BOOST

- to. The weight of the bullet 3 kg.
- b. Each competitor will be entitled to make three (3) attempts.
- c. The competitor will use the full technique or the final phase.

7. RELAYS

- to. A mixed 4x100m relay will be run for each category. (U13 and U15)
- b. The relay must be composed of two (2) boys and two (2) girls
- c. The order of the team is decided by each team (e.g. boy, girl, boy, girl)
- d. The pole exchange area shall be thirty (30) meters and there shall be no pre-zone or acceleration zone.
- and. No points will be awarded for relays. However, medals will be awarded to the first three (3) places in each category.

AWARDS AND SCORES

Scoring will be made according to the games score tables for the NACAC age group competition. The prizes will be awarded as follows:

- a) A Gold, Silver and Bronze medal will be awarded for the **first three places in each individual event** in each category. Competitors who finish **4th through 8th place** in each event will receive a medal.
- b) A trophy will be awarded to the **first three INDIVIDUAL overall winners of each category** with the highest total number of points accumulated in the entire competition. TOTAL 12 TROPHIES (4 categories)
- c) A trophy will be awarded to the **first three TEAMS in each category** with the highest total number of points accumulated in the entire competition. *TOTAL 12 TROPHIES (4 categories)*
- d) A trophy will be awarded to the **COUNTRY with the total sum** of all points in all categories. This will include both men's and women's divisions. 1 TROPHY
